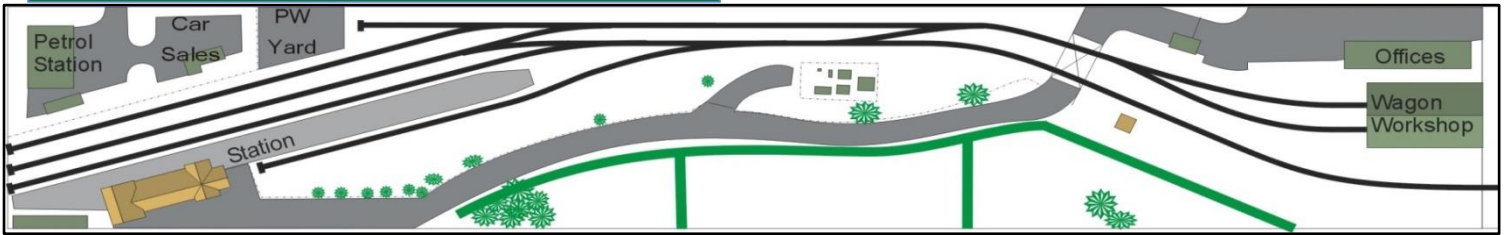

POWER: 1 x 13amp (own RCD device)

DESCRIPTION & HISTORY

Our 1965ish 3rd rail BR(S) Nictun Borrud is a layout which was based on the US Army building a branch line during WWII. Had it been built, it would have come from the Meon Valley Line to Southwick House (Supreme Headquarters Allied Expeditionary Force (SHAEF) HQ in WWII) just behind Portsdown Hill, near Portsmouth.

As co-builder of NB, I liked it so much I thought I would replicate it and bring it into the 21st century based on it surviving the Dr Beaching cuts and prospering today. (also to run my modern stock).

The goods yard has gone, replaced by car sales, petrol station and a Permanent Way yard also the old derelict WWII military sidings developed to house a Wagon & Loco maintenance facility. The Power Sub Station has also been upgraded along with the track diagram.
